

INTRODUCTION

Congratulations on the purchase of your new dishwasher. We trust you will be delighted with it. Please read this instruction book carefully. It will give you the information you need to:


- · care for, and
- use your dishwasher

Contact your nearest Authorised Service Centre if you need advice. You will find their addresses in the warranty information on the last page of this document. Your retailer can also tell you the name of your nearest service agent.

Installation Double Checks

Before you use your dishwasher, check that the installer has:

- Adjusted the leveling legs to ensure that the door opens & closes without rubbing against the sides of the tub.
- Plugged in the power cord & turned on the power.
- Connected the drain hose to the fully drilled out drain spigot.





• Tested the dishwasher using the "Rinse" cycle.

Safety Warnings

- Dishwasher detergents are very alkaline and extremely dangerous if swallowed.
 Be careful to:
 - Keep them away from your eyes and skin.
 - Keep children away from the dishwasher when the door is open.
 - Only put detergent in the dispenser when you are ready to wash.
 - Check that the detergent receptacle in the dispenser is empty after completion of the wash cycle.
- The door should not be left open as this can present a tripping hazard.
- Knives and other utensils with sharp points must be loaded in the basket with their points down or placed in a horizontal position.
- Be careful when opening the door during wash cycle. To avoid burn injury, slightly open door and wait until spray arms and wash action stops. Failure to do so may result in hot water splashing out of the dishwasher.
- Use care unloading the dishware when the "Boosted Dry" option has been selected. Contents may be hot to touch immediately after the end of cycle.
- This appliance is not intended for use by young children or infirm persons, without supervision.
- Young children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the appliance.
- If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer or its service agent or a similarly qualified person in order to avoid a hazard.

INTRODUCTION

How your dishwasher works:

The way your dishwasher works is quite simple

- Water enters the unit through an inlet hose & a water valve.
- A level switch controls the amount of water received into the unit. A dishwasher does
 not fill up, like a washing machine. It uses much less water than a washing machine.
- During the main wash, a heater hidden under the stainless steel tub, heats the water.
- Detergent that you added to the dispenser, is dispensed in the main wash and is gradually dissolved in heated water.
- This solution is then pumped through the spray arms, and the force of the water makes the spray arms rotate so that all items in the baskets are reached. This wash action removes the soil from your dishes.
- Depending on wash program and option selected, during the final rinse, the water is heated to high temperatures and a small dose of rinse aid is automatically injected into the water. This rinse aid stops water droplets clinging to washed items, and along with the heat generated from the high water temperature, dries the items in the dishwasher.




To run your dishwasher, follow these basic steps


- Load Dishwasher
- Add Detergent
- Fill Rinse Aid Rinse aid must be filled to ensure good drying performance



- Close the dishwasher door.
- Select & start desired wash program.







OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

Program selection Guide

Models 907, 915 & 925

Wash times are approximate and vary by options selected. An automatic sensor checks the incoming water temperature for the main wash of each cycle, delaying the timer if necessary, until the water is hot enough.

NOTE

- 1) All values are indicative. Variations will occur due to loading of dishes, soil level, inlet water temperature, water pressure and voltage fluctuations etc.
- 2) Program combinations may differ depending on model & market
- 3) Use normal detergent for programs marked with a x
- 4) Where fitted, the fan keeps running for an additional 20 minutes to assist drying. This happens at cycle completion and is not a fault.

Operation Selection Guide

Program Button

- Press this button repeatedly to select the program you want.
- Press & hold this button for 3 seconds during a wash to cancel program.

Start Button

• Press the start button to commence the selected program.



- Pressing the start button again during a wash program will pause the machine, and a "P" will flash in the display (All lights will flash on Model 907)
- Pressing the start/pause button again will continue the wash program.

Progress Indicator Lights

Shows the progress and position in the program. Model 907 Model 915 / 925

Program is finished when all Progress Indicator Lights are off.

Door may be opened and dishes removed during dry cycle. If this is done please let the dry cycle finish or cancel program before starting the dishwasher again.

Digital Display Window (Models 915 & 925)



Unit in Program Selection mode → Select program and press Start



Shows approximate remaining time of the wash cycle.

The initial wash time shown in the digital display window may vary over time. The dishwasher adjusts the displayed wash time after each wash depending on the wash load and water conditions detected



Unit in 2 hours Delay Start mode → To Cancel hold "Delay" button for 3 seconds



Unit in Pause mode → Press Start button to continue wash program



Not Filling Fault

→ Check water supply & tap.

→ Check inlet hose filter



Not Draining Fault

→ Check drain hose for kinks.

→ Check sink trap spigot is not blocked and fully drilled out.

→ Check filters and clean if dirty.



Overfill Fault

→ Turn off water tap and power

→ Call service



Electrical Fault

→ Turn off water tap and power

→ Call service

Option Selection Guide

Delay Start Option

This option is available on models 915 / 925 and allows you to automatically delay starting your dishwasher from 1 to 19 hours.



- Select the desired wash program.
- Press the DELAY button repeatedly until the desired time is shown in the status window. (Eg: For a 2 hour delay, press DELAY until "2H" appears)
- Press the START button. The program will start when the delayed time expires.

To cancel the delayed start, hold the DELAY button in for 3 seconds.

Boosted Dry Option

To gain enhanced drying performance by boosting the temperature and time during the final rinse, use this procedure:

- Select Normal or Normal Eco wash program
- Press PROGRAM and START buttons simultaneously. The estimated wash time shown on the display will increase by around 10 20 minutes indicating that the Boosted Dry Option is on.
- On model 907 the "Dry" progress indicator will come on for 3 seconds.
- Press START to begin wash program


To turn off Boosted Dry, repeat the above procedure.

Boosted Dry remains on for subsequent cycles until turned off.

The Boosted Dry option does not apply to the Rinse or Fragile wash programs.

Child Lock Option


The Child Lock has 3 states: 1) Child Lock On, 2) Temporarily Unlock, 3) Child Lock Off


Dish Care & Preparation

- Your dishwasher is not a waste disposal unit so please take care to remove all large food scraps from your dishes before loading in the dishwasher.
- Place crockery and glassware so that they do not touch. This will allow them to wash.
- Do not use your dishwasher for cutlery with wooden or bone handles. Do not wash items that have glued parts. Long periods in hot water may damage them.
- You can wash most good quality plastics in dishwashers. However, do not force them into racks
 or they will change shape. Do not put items that soften at temperatures of 55°C and over into
 the dishwasher.

Adjusting Upper Basket Height

Non- Easy Lift system (if applicable)

- · Make sure the basket is empty.
- Remove the end clip on each rail.
- Reposition the basket on its lower set of wheels.
- Replace the clips




Easy Lift system (if applicable)

The upper basket height can be easily adjusted to accommodate loading taller dishes in either basket. Height can be adjusted with or without dishes in the basket.


To accommodate taller dishes in the lower basket, raise the basket height as follows:

- Lift the upper basket on each side, vertically. The self-guided adjusting mechanism will stop when the raised position is reached.
- The raised position provides nearly 50mm of additional height for items in the lower basket.



To accommodate taller dishes in the upper basket, lower the upper basket height as follows:

- Lift the upper basket on each side, vertically, until it lifts and unlocks.
- Gently lower the rack into the lower position. The selfguided adjusting mechanism will stop when the lowered position is reached.
- This position provides nearly 50mm of additional height for items in the top basket




LOADING YOUR DISHWASHER

Loading The Upper Basket

12 Place Setting Load


The upper basket is designed for flexibility in loading a wide variety of items including cups, glasses, stemware, small plates, bowls, etc.

- · Load glasses in upper basket.
- Load items with open ends facing down for better cleaning and draining.
- Be sure nothing protrudes through the bottom of the basket to block rotation of middle spray arm.
- Figure on the right shows a normal 12 place setting loaded in accordance with Australian standard AS/NZS 2007.1.




Utensil Rack (if applicable)

- The utensil rack can be used in the upper basket to hold spatulas, large spoons and other large utensils.
- Be sure that items in rack do not prevent upper spray arm from rotating.



Cup - Wine Glass Racks

- The cup racks may be placed in the up or down position to add flexibility. The cup racks can also secure wine glasses at an angle for best wash ability.
- Because wine glasses come in various sizes, after loading, slowly push in the rack to make sure they will clear the top of the dishwasher.



Note

- Before closing the door, please ensure that the upper basket is fully pushed into the dishwasher engaging it into the rear water feed connection.
- Details & accessories in basket may differ depending on model and market.


LOADING YOUR DISHWASHER

Loading The Lower Basket

12 Place Setting Load


The lower basket is designed for plates, saucers, bowls, and cookware.

- Large items should be placed along the edge so they do not block the middle spray arm rotation.
- Make sure tall items do not block middle spray arm rotation.
- Be sure pan handles do not protrude through the bottom of the basket and block the lower spray arm rotation
- Figure on the right shows a normal 12 place setting loaded in accordance with Australian standard AS/NZS 2007.1.




Fold-down Tines (if applicable)

- The fold-down tines in the lower basket make easy loading for those extra large and hard-to-fit items. The tines may be left up for normal use or folded down for more flexible loading.
- Fold tines down for easy loading of large pots or pans.



Cutlery Basket

- Place cutlery in the basket, some up, some down to get the best wash.
 Separate cutlery of different materials, e.g. stainless steel and silver, into different compartments.
- Load sharp pointed knives with the point down for safety reasons.



Note

- Before closing the door, please ensure that the lower basket is fully pushed in.
- Details & accessories in basket may differ depending on model and market.

DETERGENT & RINSE AID DISPENSER

Safety Warning

Dishwasher detergents are very alkaline and extremely dangerous if swallowed. Be careful to:

- Keep them away from your eyes and skin.
- Keep children away from the dishwasher when the door is open.
- Not fill the dispenser until you are ready to use the dishwasher.

Detergents

- Use the amount of detergent needed, depending on:
 - the softness or hardness of the water
 - the soil level of the dishes
- Soft water and lightly soiled dishes generally require 10 to 20 grams of powdered detergent; hard water and heavily soiled dishes 20 to 30 grams.
- Note: Fill only compartment 15 if you use concentrated detergents.
- Try using different amounts to get best results from the water in your area. This may vary from the quantities suggested above.
- A white film or scale may build up in your dishwasher pump housing and filters over time, especially in hard water conditions. If this happens, use a descaler every six months to reduce these deposits. Contact your local service centre if you need more information.
- For testing to Australian standard AS/NZS 2007.1, use the "Normal ECO" wash. Place 20 grams of detergent in the dispenser compartment and 10 grams of detergent in the depression of the door.

Combi Detergent or Detergent & Rinse Aid Tablets

General Advice

- Use strictly according to the detergent manufacturers instructions.
- Do not place the tablets in the tub or in the cutlery basket as this will result in poorer wash results. The tablets should be placed in the detergent dispenser compartment.
- If you encounter problems using detergent tablets for the first time then please contact the detergent manufacturers care line (the telephone number is given on the product packaging).


Special Advice

- If you use detergent tablets that do not contain Rinse Aid, then you must use Rinse Aid as for normal detergent powder. Follow the instructions on page 12.
- When using '3-in-1' Combi tablets, you may need to use a small amount of rinse aid as well, particularly in hard water areas. (See page 16 "Too many suds" for guidance on water softness).
- Best drying performance will be obtained by using the "Boosted Dry" option.
- Detergent Tablets from different manufacturers dissolve at different rates. For this reason some tablets cannot develop their full cleaning power during short or low temperature programs. Therefore, when using tablets, best wash performance will be obtained on "Sensor", "Normal" or "Heavy" wash programs.

DETERGENT & RINSE AID DISPENSER

Filling The Detergent Dispenser

- Ensure that the inside of the detergent dispenser is dry before loading the detergent.
- Always use fresh, good quality machine dishwashing detergent. Do not use regular hand washing detergents as these will cause severe foaming.
- If using a concentrate dishwashing detergent, add a small dose (approx 15g) to the detergent compartment.
- If using a regular dishwashing detergent add a large dose (approx 25g) to the detergent compartment.
- Extra detergent may be used if the load is large and greasy, or if the local water supply is very hard.
- Close the dispenser lid. The dispenser will automatically dispense the detergent at the correct time during the dishwasher program.



Filling The Rinse Aid Dispenser

Rinse aid greatly improves drying and reduces water spots and filming. It causes the water to "sheet" off the dishes rather than form water droplets that cling and leave spots. You must use sufficient rinse aid to get good drying performance. This is especially important with plastic dishes.


The rinse aid dispenser, located next to the detergent cup, automatically releases a measured amount of rinse aid during the final rinse. If spotting and poor drying are problems, increase the amount of rinse aid dispensed. Use a screw-driver if required.

To adjust the rinse aid dose:

- Remove the dispenser cap by turning it counter clockwise and lift out.
- To increase the rinse aid dose, turn the internal dial counter clockwise to a higher number.
- To decrease the rinse aid dose, turn the internal dial clockwise to a lower number.
- Make sure that you close the cap firmly.

To fill the liquid rinse aid:

- Remove the dispenser cap by turning it counter clockwise and lift out.
- Pour in rinse aid until the indicator lens (located adjacent to the dispenser cap) indicates that the dispenser is full.
- Make sure that you close the cap firmly.
- Wipe up any spills with a damp cloth.
- The dispenser holds 125ml, enough for 35-140 washes, depending on setting.




MAINTAINING YOUR DISHWASHER

Cleaning the wash filters


The filters should be checked and cleaned regularly. Blocked filters will result in poor wash performance.

- Open the door & remove the lower basket.
- The dishwasher filter system comprises a coarse/fine filter, microfilter and a flat filter. Unlock the filter system using the handle on the microfilter.
- Turn the handle about 1/4 a turn anticlockwise and remove.
- Take hold of the coarse/fine filter (1) by the handle with the hole and remove from the microfilter (2).
- Clean all filters thoroughly under running water.
- Remove the flat filter (3) from the base of the washing compartment and clean both faces thoroughly.
- Put the flat filter back in the base of the washing compartment.
- Place the coarse/fine filter in the microfilter and press together.
- Put the filter combination in place and lock by turning the handle clockwise to the stop. It will "click" into its correct position. During this process ensure that the flat filter does not protrude above the base of the washing compartment.

The dishwasher must not be used without filters under any circumstances. Do not let any foreign objects (e.g. Broken Crockery, Glass, etc.) fall in the pump beneath the filters before they are refitted.








Cleaning the spray arms

The spray arm should be checked and cleaned regularly. Blocked spray jet holes will give poor wash results.

- Remove the lower basket. Remove the lower spray arm and unblock holes by picking out dirt particles with tweezers.
- Remove clips from upper basket rails (see pic). Remove upper basket.
- Clean the upper spray arm by picking out dirt particles with tweezers.

 Do not try to remove spray arm from basket as it may break or crack.



General Cleaning

For occasional cleaning of door & control panel, use a soft cloth dampened with mild soapy water. Do not use any abrasive cleaners. Rinse & dry with a clean cloth.


Do not use stainless steel cleaners to clean the control panel as the chemicals in it may damage the paint and / or remove the printing from the panel.

Light Globe replacement (if applicable)

In the event of the light globe requiring replacement, follow these instructions:

- Switch off your dishwasher and disconnect the dishwasher power cord from the power supply.
- Unscrew the lens anticlockwise from within the dishwasher.
- Remove the globe and replace with a maximum 15 Watt bayonet globe no larger than 26 mm in diameter and 56 mm long.
- Ensure seal is correctly fitted to the lens, then replace lens by screwing it firmly into place.

The plastic lens must be secured before reconnecting power to the unit. Failing to do this may potentially cause an unsafe operating environment.



HELP & PROBLEM SOLVING GUIDE

Helpful Hints.

- The NORMAL ECO program saves water and energy. It runs at a lower temperature so it is not suitable for heavily soiled wash loads. To save energy, dry performance is reduced so you may have to open the door at the end of the wash cycle or even towel dry some dishes.
- The Child Lock option disables the button from functioning to prevent children from starting or disrupting a dishwasher in use. It does not lock the door. See instructions on page 6 & 7.
- Because this dishwasher has a hidden heating element, dishwasher proof plastic dishes can be safely placed in the bottom basket.
- We recommend that you buy kitchen equipment which is dishwasher safe.
- Using your dishwasher over a long time may discolour or fade some types of dishes (e.g. ones with the pattern on top of the glaze) and aluminium saucepans.
- If you often wash lead crystal glass, they will become opaque (not clear).
- If you take more than one day to fill the dishwasher, rinse your dishes by using the "Rinse" program at the end of the each day.
- Do not use stainless steel cleaners to clean the control panel as the chemicals in it may damage the paint and / or remove the printing from the panel.
- Do not use steel wool, aerosol or solvent cleaners on any part of your dishwasher.
- Do not use lumpy or stale detergent. It will give you a poor wash.
- If you do not intend using your dishwasher for several weeks:
 - 1. Open the door a little
 - 2. Switch off the power
 - 3. Turn off the water supply.

If you need help follow these steps.

- Before you call for service....
 Check to see if you can fix the problem using the guide on the next page
- 2. If you need service....

Get the model number, serial number and date of purchase from the details recorded on the inside front cover, or from the label on the inner door, before you phone. There is an extensive network of trained service personnel who will fit only genuine spare parts. Phone number of the service centre is shown on the last page of this book.

General Terms and Conditions

- In this warranty
 - 'Electrolux' means Electrolux Home Products Pty Ltd ABN 51 004 762 341 in respect of Appliances purchased in Australia and Electrolux (NZ) Limited in respect of Appliances purchased in New Zealand;
 - 'Appliance' means any Electrolux product purchased by you accompanied by this document;
 - 'Warranty Period' means
 - where you use the Appliance for personal, domestic or household purposes in Australia the period of 24 months and in New Zealand the period of 24 months:
 - where you use the Appliance for commercial purposes, the period of 0 months, (if the period stated is 0 months you are not covered by this product warranty) following the date of original purchase of the Appliance;
 - 'you' means the purchaser of the Appliance not having purchased the appliance for re-sale, and 'your' has a corresponding meaning.
- This warranty only applies to Appliances purchased and used in Australia or New Zealand and is in addition to (and does not exclude, restrict, or modify in any way) any non-excludable statutory warranties in Australia or New Zealand.
- Electrolux warrants that, when dispatched from an Electrolux warehouse, the Appliance is free from defects in materials and workmanship for the Warranty Period.
- During the Warranty Period Electrolux or its Authorised Service Centre will, at no extra charge and subject to these terms and conditions, repair or replace any parts which it considers to be defective. You agree that any replaced Appliances or parts become the property of Electrolux. This warranty does not apply to light globes, batteries, filters or similar perishable parts.
- Parts and Appliances not supplied by Electrolux are not covered by this warranty.
- Where you are within an Electrolux service area, this warranty covers the cost of transport of the Appliance to and from Authorised Service Centres of Electrolux and travelling costs for representatives of the Authorised Service Centre to and from your home or business. If you are outside an Electrolux service area, you will bear these costs. For information about whether you are within an Electrolux service area, please phone 13 13 49 in Australia, or 0800 10 66 10 in New Zealand.
- Proof of purchase is required before you can make a claim under this warranty
- You may not make a claim under this warranty unless the defect claimed is due to faulty or defective parts or workmanship

Electrolux is not liable in the following situations (which are not exhaustive):

- (a) The Appliance is damaged by:
 - accident
 - misuse or abuse, including failure to properly (ii) maintain or service
 - (iii) normal wear and tear
 - (iv) power surges, electrical storm damage or incorrect power supply
 - (v) incomplete or improper installation
 - incorrect, improper or inappropriate operation (vi)
 - (vii) insect or vermin infestation.
- (b) The Appliance is modified without authority from Electrolux in writing.
- (c) The Appliance's serial number or warranty seal has been removed or defaced.
- (d) The Appliance was serviced or repaired by anyone other than Electrolux or its Authorised Service Centres.
- 9. This warranty, the contract to which it relates and the relationship between you and Electrolux are governed by the law applicable in the State where the Appliance is purchased if the Appliance is purchased in Australia or the law applicable in New Zealand if the Appliance is purchased there. Where the Appliance is purchased in New Zealand for business purposes the Consumer Guarantee Act does not apply.

Limitation of Liability

- To the extent permitted by law:
 - (a) Electrolux excludes all warranties other than as contained in this document;
 - Electrolux shall not be liable for any loss or damage whether direct or indirect or consequential arising from your purchase, use or non-use of the Appliance.
- 11. Provisions of the Trade Practices Act and State consumer legislation in Australia, and the Consumer Guarantees Act, the Sale of Goods Act and the Fair Trading Act in New Zealand, imply warranties or conditions, or impose obligations, upon Electrolux which cannot be excluded, restricted or modified. To the extent permitted by law, the liability of Electrolux (if any) arising out of or in relation to the Appliance or any services supplied by Electrolux shall be limited (where it is fair and reasonable to do so),:
 - (a) in the case of Appliances, at its option, to the replacement or repair of the Appliances or the supply of equivalent products or the payment of the cost of replacing the Appliances or having the Appliances repaired or of acquiring equivalent Appliances. Upon being replaced, parts and Appliances become the property of Electrolux; or
 - (b) in the case of services, at its option, to the supply of the services again or the payment of the cost of having the services re-supplied;

and in the case of Appliances or services supplied in New Zealand, loss or damage whether direct or indirect or consequential that is reasonably foreseeable.

Privacy

You acknowledge that in the event that you make a warranty claim it will be necessary for Electrolux and its Authorised Service Centres to exchange information in relation to you to enable Electrolux to meet its obligations under this warranty.
